LITERACY FOR MORE

For Live Oak Public Libraries (LOPL), 2023 was another year of amazing growth. More patrons are discovering the depth and variety of our collection and services. Larger numbers of the community are benefitting from the professional, knowledgeable, and welcoming staff we have in 16 branches across Chatham, Effingham, and Liberty counties.

We are thrilled to see more people in library buildings and online, borrowing Chromebooks and Hotspots, enjoying free, amazing programs, "borrowing" ukuleles and park and museum passes, engaging during Storytime, and using "Books on the Go" for the homebound.

On the following pages of this annual report for FY2023, the numbers are impressive. We estimate that LOPL provided \$19.2 million in value in 2023, about 3.5% more than in FY2022, despite a slightly lower year-on-year operating budget. To us, that means we are working harder, but smarter, and with more focus. But we want to do more.

A Conversation with Our Communities

In Fall 2023, we kicked off a strategic planning project, using a respected and experienced consulting firm to ensure an unbiased and objective process. It has been **fifteen years** since a comprehensive strategic plan was developed for LOPL. In this period, so much has changed in our communities and within best practices for public libraries. Technology is dramatically changing the way we as a society deliver and receive information and the written word. And in the greater Savannah area, we all know the demographics and size of our populations are undergoing enormous change. Our strategic plan will help us to align the Libraries' future with the needs and wants of those we serve.

We expect to complete the strategic planning process, and to communicate a forward-looking five-year plan, by the end of calendar year 2024. We've had amazing community participation in surveys and focus groups across the three counties.

Committed to What's Next

As we look to the future, you will see new faces in our branches and in our communities as we build out our organization to support more programs, outreach, and materials for borrowing. We also remain focused on staff development and training at all levels for LOPL employees - so they can continue to support literacy and life-long learning for all community members with consistency.

And all ages have fun with Summer Reading Challenge!


We are grateful for our community partners for their collaboration to help make these initiatives possible.
